TBH Helps Combat Local Food Insecurity

According to Feeding America, 1 in 7 Americans struggle with hunger. Food insecurity exists in nearly every community in the United States, including our own.

TBH has put into place a few programs to help combat local food insecurity. Six years ago, The Bellevue Hospital Community Garden was started. With the hard work and dedication from over 60 active TBH employees and volunteers, and the expert advice from Huron County Master Gardeners, the garden has grown significantly in size and produce yield. The garden started as a 12' x 24' plot, and is now 100' x 100' in size.


All produce harvested from the garden is donated to Bellevue and Clyde food banks to help feed local families.

"So far in the 2016 growing season, over 1,205 pounds of produce has been harvested from the garden and donated," noted Patti Keller, RD, LD, CDE, with TBH's Dietary Department.

Produce donated include items such as onions, radishes, cucumbers, green/wax beans, peppers, broccoli, eggplant, lettuce, kale, chard and spinach.

"Access to healthy food options is often limited for individuals with lower income, or individuals in need. The produce we donate gives access to healthier food choices and introduces individuals to potentially new foods to try," continued Keller.

Besides the Community Garden, TBH also donates frozen box lunches to the Clyde Food Pantry and Bellevue's Fish and Loaves Food Pantry. For 2016, the hospital has been able to provide nearly 1,600 frozen meals to families in need.

TBH Offers Seasonal Flu Shot Clinics

The Bellevue Hospital is offering seasonal flu shots for anyone ages 18-64. The cost is \$29 for the regular vaccine. A high-dose vaccine for ages 65 and older is \$63. The shots will be fully covered for those with Medicare Part B or Medicare Advantage cards only. Those who are eligible must present their Medicare Part B/Medicare Advantage card prior to receiving their flu shot. No Medicaid or private insurance will be accepted to cover the cost of seasonal flu shots. Cash, check or Medicare Part B/Medicare Advantage Cards only.
