The DAISY Award for Extraordinary Nurses[®] is an international award supported by the DAISY Foundation, a nonprofit organization with a mission to recognize the extraordinary, compassionate care that nurses provide patients and families every day.



The DAISY Foundation was established in memory of J. Patrick Barnes, by members of his family. Patrick died at the age of 33 in late 1999 from complications of Idiopathic

Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP), a little known but not uncommon autoimmune disease. (DAISY is an acronym for Diseases Attacking the Immune System.) The care Patrick

and his family received from nurses while he was ill inspired this unique means of thanking nurses for making a profound difference in the lives of their patients and patient families.

Nurses at TBH may be nominated by patients, families, visitors and colleagues. Awards are presented throughout the year at celebrations attended by the honoree's colleagues. Each honoree receives a certificate commending her or him as an "Extraordinary Nurse." Honorees also receive a DAISY Award pin and a beautiful and meaningful sculpture called "A Healer's Touch," hand-carved by artists of the Shona Tribe in Zimbabwe.


Selvon St. Clair, M.D. Orthopedic Spine Surgery
