## Stroke Awareness Month

### Anyone Can Have a Stroke, Everyone Should Be Prepared

Stroke is a leading cause of death in the United States and is a major cause of serious disability for adults. About 795,000 people in the United States have a stroke each year. But, fast treatment for a stroke can lessen the brain damage that a stroke can cause. By knowing the signs and symptoms of a stroke, you can take quick action and perhaps save a life.

Signs of stroke in men and women include:

- Sudden **numbness** or weakness in the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- Sudden **confusion**, trouble speaking, or difficulty in understanding speech.
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden **trouble walking**, dizziness, loss of balance, or lack of coordination.
- Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the stroke treatments that work best are available only if the stroke is recognized and diagnosed within three hours of the first symptom.

If you think someone may be having a stroke, remember to act F.A.S.T. and do the following test:

F - Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

A — Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

**S** — **Speech:** Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is the speech slurred or strange?

**T** — **Time:** If you see any of these signs, call 9-1-1 right away.

The award is part of the DAISY Foundation's mission to recognize the extraordinary, compassionate nursing care they provide patients and families every day.

The DAISY Foundation is a not-for-profit organization, established in memory of J. Patrick Barnes, by members of his family. Patrick died at the age of 33 in late 1999 from complications of Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP), a little known but not uncommon autoimmune disease. (DAISY is an acronym for Diseases Attacking the Immune System.) The care Patrick and his family received from nurses while he was ill inspired this unique means of thanking nurses for making a profound difference in the lives of their patients and families.

The awards program at The Bellevue Hospital began in January 2020 and nominations are continuously accepted throughout the year. The award recipient is then chosen by a committee at TBH to receive The DAISY Award. Awards are presented throughout the year at celebrations attended by the Honoree's colleagues. Each Honoree receives a certificate commending her or him as an "Extraordinary Nurse." Honorees also receive a DAISY Award pin and a beautiful and meaningful sculpture called *A Healer's Touch*, hand-carved by artists of the Shona Tribe in Zimbabwe.
