Selecting the Primary Care Provider That's Right for You

A primary care provider is a health care practitioner that treats a wide range of health issues and can help coordinate your medical treatment with various specialists.

Primary care providers (PCP) are trained to treat individuals of all ages for a variety of medical issues, including disease prevention and maintenance.

What type of primary care provider is right for you? You can choose from several different types of primary care professionals:

- Family Practitioners (FP): Doctors who have completed a family medicine residency and are board-certified, or board-eligible, for this specialty. A family practitioner is trained to care for a person from infancy to advanced age.
- Internists (Internal Medicine): Doctors who have completed a residency in internal medicine and are board-certified, or board-eligible, in this specialty. An internist is a doctor who helps prevent, treat and diagnose a wide variety of medical conditions for adults only.
- Nurse Practitioners (NP): A registered nurse with advanced education, clinical training and certification. NPs, similar to doctors, diagnose and treat various illnesses and injuries, perform examinations and strongly emphasize preventative care. NPs work in collaboration with a designated doctor.

- Obstetricians/Gynecologists (OB/GYN): Doctors who have completed a residency and are board-certified, or board-eligible, in this specialty. They specialize in women's reproductive health including family planning, pregnancy and delivery.
- Pediatricians (PED): Doctors who have completed a pediatric residency and are board-certified, or board-eligible, in this specialty. They specialize in the health care of newborns, infants, children, and adolescents.
- Physician Assistants (PA): Medical providers with advanced education and clinical training. PAs are trained in the medical model (disease-centered focus) alongside physicians. PAs work in collaboration with a designated doctor. PAs routinely diagnose illnesses and injuries, perform examinations, provide treatment which includes prescribing medication, and may be involved in surgical procedures.
