

September is Pain Awareness Month

What do you think of when you hear the term "chronic pain?" Chronic pain affects almost 100 million Americans and is an important condition to identify and treat.

According to the American Chronic Pain Association, chronic pain is "ongoing or recurrent pain, lasting beyond the usual course of injury or more than three to six months, and adversely affecting the individual's well-being."

Chronic pain varies in intensity and frequency. Some people experience chronic pain constantly, while others only feel it in episodes.

If you feel any kind of consistent pain for six months, you most likely are suffering from chronic pain. Pain can originate from a wide variety of sources. When it comes to chronic pain, the main sources are:

- Joint pain Back pain
- Headaches
- Injury related pain

If you have ever worried that you are experiencing chronic pain, you can start by asking yourself if you are experiencing these symptoms:

- Constantly feeling any level of pain, mild to severe
- Aching, shooting or burning types of pain
- Extended feelings of soreness, stiffness or tightness

Aside from physical issues caused by chronic pain, many individuals also report psychological struggles, such as fatigue, mood changes, stress, anxiety, depression, irritability and restless nights of sleep. 
